

COUNTIES UNDER TOWNSHIP ORGANIZATION COLLECTOR'S WARRANT

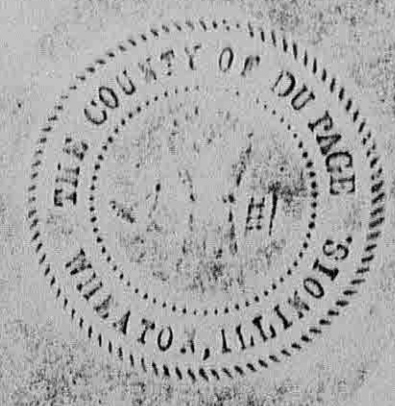
The people of the State of Illinois, to George E. Ruchty, Jr. County Collector of Du Page County, State of Illinois—GREETING:

You are hereby commanded to levy and collect from the several persons named in the tax roll or book to which this warrant is attached and here-
with committed to you (the same being the taxes assessed upon the real estate and personal property in the Town of York
in said County, for the year A. D. 1946, and former years, including interest, penalties and costs as therein shown), the several sums of money entered
in the column of totals of said tax roll or book opposite their respective names. And it shall be your duty immediately upon receipt of such tax roll or
book to cause a notice to be published and posted as the law provides, stating when and where in such town you will be prepared to receive such taxes.
And in case any person named in said roll or book shall neglect or refuse to pay his, her or their personal property tax as therein imposed and demanded,
you shall levy the same, together with the costs and charges that may accrue, by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of such person, as the law
directs. Out of the moneys collected by you by virtue hereof after deducting the compensation or commissions to which you are legally entitled you will
pay over as follows, to-wit: To the proper school officer or officers, the school taxes; to the treasurer of the road and bridge fund, the amount of taxes
collected for road and bridge purposes; to the supervisor of the town, the taxes levied and collected for town purposes; to the city or incorporated town
or village treasurer or other proper officers, the taxes and special assessments collected by you for such city or incorporated town or village, and other
taxes to other proper officers or persons as often and at such times as may be demanded in accordance with law; to the County Treasurer, the county and
special taxes, and to the State Treasurer, the taxes payable to the State Treasurer collected by you, at the time or times and in the manner directed by
law. And pay over and make settlement of all taxes and special assessments collected by you to the proper authorities or persons at such time or times
and in manner as the statute provides and directs. All of which payments herein specified to be made, and return this book to the County Clerk
immediately after the settlement made with the above enumerated officers and persons as required by law.

Hereof fail not to make returns of your doings by virtue hereof, under penalty of the law in such case made and provided.
